Hot trend for 2016: Iceland is the new Belgium, in artistic spheres. The collaborators and outer circle who grew up around the Sugar Cubes, Bjork and Sigur Ros are making ever more intriguing side projects and exploring uncharted creative avenues.

Fearless prediction: The world is still changing so quickly, and while it seems as though it has been shrunk to fit in an app, in reality old-school experiences are still at the heart of what we all want. I think what we all need in the next year are journeys in which we turn off, tune out, and drop in.
